- I. Call to Order
 - a. Meeting called to order at 2:04 p.m.
- II. Approval of Agenda

- III. Approval of Minutes—GEGC Meeting, March 24, 2025

- IV. New Courses
 - a. **HSC 201**: Introduction to Public Health—Requesting Lower Div Life Sciences (B2)
 - i. Overall Comments course lacks sufficient life sciences content and leans heavily toward the social science aspects of public health
 - ii. Non-GE SLOs non-GE SLOs should be reduced in number and revised to incorporate more life sciences content in order to better meet Area B2 criteria.
 - iii. Bibliography should include additional life sciences content, with particular emphasis on sources from the biological sciences
 - iv. Recommendation table HSC 201
 - 1. Approved by acclimation
 - b. **HSC 227**: Drugs and Health—Requesting Lower Div U.S History (D1)
 - i. Overall Comments course lacks sufficient historical content
 - ii. Non-GE SLOs non-GE SLOs should place greater emphasis on historical content
 - iii. Week by week the course does not explicitly address several key topics outlined in Area D1
 - iv. Bibliography lacks inclusion of historical sources
 - v. Recommendation approve HSC 227 for area D1
 - 1. Not approved with 0 "yes" votes, 0 "abstain" votes, and 14 "no" votes
- V. Proposals submitted after deadline.
 - i. Discussion: Committee perspectives on late submissions and whether to consider a grace period policy.

1. Committee members affirmed that GEGC should adhere to the established deadline without exceptions to maintain fairness and consistency.

VI. Curriculum Changes and GE Certification

- i. Discussion: Committee perspectives on minor curriculum changes (e.g., course renumbering) and whether reapproval or documentation should be required for GE certification continuity.
 - 1. Committee members agreed that minor changes, such as course numbering or title adjustments, do not require full re-approval. Discussion followed on potential solutions for documenting GE course modifications, including developing a change log form and creating a database of all GE forms for easier reference.
