
Fall 2025 application is now open!



Two important concepts for grad school writing

- 1. Writing for a professional, discipline-specific, academic audience (Ask yourself: Who's my reader? Why are they reading this? Meet the reader's needs)
- 2. Overcoming anxiety, stress, and (even) depression related to writing and academics (e.g., the myth of "writer's block" as a magical "writer's disease." More realistic: Depression, anxiety, & stress caused by, or associated with, writing)

We don't have time to go over these in detail, but the next few slides will introduce you to resources at CSULB to support your learning about these concepts.



Reasonable Accommodations



What are reasonable accommodations?

- "Reasonable accommodations are modifications or adjustments to the tasks, environment, or to the way things are usually done that enable individuals with disabilities to have an equal opportunity to participate in an academic program or a job" (U.S. Department of Education, 2007).
- Should not alter the fundamental nature or requirements of the academic course or program of matriculation.

Reasonable accommodations provided by BMAC:

- Exam accommodations:
 - Extended time
 - Distraction-reduced or private environment
 - Paging flexibility (online exams)
 - Reader/scribe
- Classroom accommodations:
 - Notetaking technology
 - Breaks as needed
 - Accessible or captioned media/materials
 - Accessible furniture

Note: This is not a comprehensive list of all accommodations for which students may be approved by BMAC.





The BMAC Interactive Process



Faculty and BMAC Student should communicate with BMAC as needed regarding accommodation adjustments, questions, or concerns within a timely manner.

BMAC Student has the responsibility to communicate accommodation needs with faculty in a timely manner, and initiate any requests for testing or classroom accommodations in accordance with BMAC policies.

> ***Upon receipt of the Faculty Notification Letter Email, Faculty are encouraged to consult with BMAC for questions or concerns regarding reasonable accommodation implementation.

Student submits SSO MyBMAC Application

> Students uploads supporting documentation from a treating professional that follows BMAC's Guidelines for Documentation

> > *Student meets with a BMAC Specialist for a Welcome Meeting. During this meeting, documentation is evaluated in conjunction with the student's declared program major and accommodations are approved/denied.

**If approved for reasonable accommodations, the student is formally registered with BMAC and is responsible for requesting or renewing individual accommodations within MyBMAC each semester for their specific classes.

Requested/renewed the MyBMAC Faculty to be sent to faculty accommodations.

Did You Know? Accommodations are designed to provide ACCESS to the learning environment. Students can be referred to the Learning Center for tutoring and academic coaching support.

If the requested accommodations are denied, student is able to appeal the denial in accordance with BMAC policies.


