6. Brainstorming

- Reviewed previous 2023-2024 Annual report discussed where it stands:
 - i. CRM is starting.
 - ii. User-friendly designs in academic advising.
 Communications Strategies concerning number of email students get per semester from campus.
 - iii. Under enrolled area has Academic Affairs, College Associate Deans and career and discovery events to address this recommendation. CLA has been working in this area to help students fit the programs.

b. Meeting structures:

c. This led to areas of potential topics:

- i. Landscape of Higher Education
 - 1. Enrollment cliff to potential number of SoCal students.
 - 2. Merit based admissions, does it meet community values and strategies on campus, "headwinds".
 - 3. State legislation with emerging bill/laws and policies, understand the impact LB enrollment.

ii. Local Education areas

- 1. Breakdown data on local EOP/ Beach promise and preference to local enrollment numbers.
- 2. Undeclared enrolled because want impacted major then leaving because cannot get that major. How to fix this false promise to an expected major.
- 3. Major declaration but need for more flexibility to change the major.

iii. State Budget

- 1. How does this affect enrollment, budget cut without having to enroll more students, not a good strategy.
- 2. Enrollment drives revenue, reducing enrollment will shrink budget, how to deal with this.
- 3. Find creative ways to deal with funding. Does this mean more asynchronous courses? Alternating online class with F2F does this create scheduling issues?
