    - Culminating activities for Master's degrees (thesis, projects, etc.)
    - Revision of Emeritus policies (rights and benefits of retired faculty)
    - Graduation Writing Assessment (GWAR); policies related to writing proficiency exam; also to what degree should we ask students to study writing over and above degree requirements?
    - Elections for CSU Academic Senate
      - Started a process to gather names of faculty from across CSU who are eligible to form an Electoral College to vote on new CSU Senate members
    - Some nerves among faculty around funding insecurities happening now at other schools due to federal policies

    - Nugget will be around until December!
    - The current University Dining Commons area will be demolished and new buildings will go in this space with a new footprint—
      - 2-story building with food vendors including Nugget!
      - Student spaces in the new bldg. as requested by students: Basic Needs, Beach Wellness, food services, ballroom, conference rooms, movie theater, entertainment (bowling. eSports, etc), lounge space, satellite office for Career Center, and more!
      - New design= wanted to maintain the architecture of the building to honor the work of the architect and style of that time
    - Addressing ADA improvements from lower to upper campus; stairways, elevators, open space; will have 4 superfast elevators open 24/7; the escalator is going away; Friendship Walk Stairs construction groundbreaking event April 9 @3:30.
    - The goal is to have a really open design style for the USU building structure so people can see what's happening inside
    - Will be adding some nice, new landscaping

# • Steven Salcido- AVP Admissions Outreach / Enrollment Management, Day at the Beach, Enrollment Overview

- The Beach is in the top 5 schools in the nation for admission applications (120,000 applications received this cycle; Fall 25 will admit about 6,000 frosh, 3500 transfer—a little lower this year because we over-admitted recently to help other CSU campuses and those students are still on campus and working through their programs)
- o Admissions is part of Student Affairs
- Admissions Funnel—starts from middle school when students are considering what school to go to; parents and family are huge influencers in this decision—end with graduation and Alumni participation. We care about the students at all these phases and take action to connect with them.
- "Impaction: when a campus receives more applications than space it can provide; at CSULB we are campus-impacted and program-impacted
- Application process opens Oct 1-Nov 30; decisions go out mid-Feb to early-April; deadline May 1 to accept offer
- o <u>Day at the Beach</u> April 12, 8am-3pm (rain or shine!):
  - Prospective students and their families can visit the campus
  - Student decisions to come here are affected by our collective efforts and thank you to all! Especially good way to promote programs with low enrollment.
- Q: How does housing affect admissions? A: Housing always affects decisions; we have shortages throughout the CSU system. Th effect on student decisions to attend CSULB is minimal because this is true everywhere and so other factors come into play.
- Q: Which programs are impacted? A: All of them!! We are a campus and programimpacted university.
