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# A LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

Our newsletter provides an opportunity to reflect on the past year and share our accomplishments with our Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies alumni and community. In October, the National Women's Studies Association and the Palestinian Feminist Collective issued statements regarding Palestine as a feminist issue and calls to action to confront systemic gendered and colonial violence and oppression. Heeding the call, our department engaged in a variety of collaborative campus events throughout the year that centered the ongoing violence and oppression in Palestine, feminist transnational solidarities, Jewish feminist solidarity with Palestine, and Queer solidarity with Palestine. It was a reminder of the importance of anti-colonial feminist perspectives and activism on our campus and in or communities.

The culmination of these events was the <u>Transnational Feminist Solidarities Conference</u> this Spring. The College of Liberal Arts Thematic Initiative, with generous support from former CLA Dean Dorothy (Dee) Abrahamse issued a call for proposals last year. The proposal for the Transnational Feminist Solidarities theme was coconstructed and submitted by five interdisciplinary feminist CLA faculty, including three WGSS faculty. This theme was selected and the conference organizers, which consisted of faculty, staff, and students, did an incredible amount of work to create a timely and inspiring two-day conference of academic discussions, activism, and art.

This year we also developed a Queer Studies Minor Advisory Committee to connect faculty who teach courses for the minor across our campus and engage collectively in queer and trans studies scholarship, events, and curriculum.

I am proud of all that we have done this year. We could not do the work that we do without our incredible Administrative Department Coordinator (and alumna!), Emily Ramirez-Uribe, who joined us during a particularly busy year and kept everything running smoothly, our WGSS student interns, who have done an excellent job with our social media and supporting our events, and our incredible faculty who give so much of their time and energy to create an engaging and dynamic academic program for our students.

As I end my first three-year term as chair and enter my second term, I am excited to continue to work with such incredible colleagues, students, and staff. I hope to connect with more of our alumni, continuing to build an engaged feminist community. #### NWSA CALLS FOR AN END TO ISRAEL'S WAR ON PALESTINE

"As we conclude our Annual Conference in Baltimore, MD, we express our strong opposition to the genocidal war on Gaza and the violence and repression against Palestinians in the West Bank and within Israel.

NWSA strongly condemns the ongoing and persistent U.S. government's support for Israel's vengeful war on Gaza. Sponsoring violence against a caged population in the name of "self-defense" makes us complicit in crimes against humanity!

Expressing solidarity with Palestinians is not Anti Semitism, nor is it an endorsement of Hamas. We are alarmed by the criminalization of free speech and academic freedom on college campuses. We call on university leaders to endorse AAUP's recent statement, which states:

'College and university officials are obligated to defend academic freedom; they must resist demands from politicians, trustees, donors, students and their parents, alumni, or other parties to punish faculty members for exercising that freedom. At this moment of heightened tension on college and university campuses, the AAUP calls on college and university administrations to fully protect the academic freedom of their faculties to teach, conduct research, and speak out about important issues both on and off campus.'


We further plead with college administrators to extend their commitment to address antisemitism to include concern for anti-muslim and anti-Arab hate speech and violence. We affirm our support for Students for Justice in Palestine (SJP) and other student groups expressing solidarity with Palestinians. NWSA will continue to center Palestine in our work and unequivocally support faculty, staff and students who address the war and its root causes.

We cannot remain silent in the face of a genocidal war.

### WGSSSA

Throughout the Spring 2024 semester, the CSULB Women's, Gender, & Sexuality Studies Student Association (WGSSSA) has been distributing reproductive health products to the campus community, sharing information on reproductive justice, and fostering a supportive community within the department and campus.

WGSSSA's members have participated in the Advocates for Youth and **Emergency Contraception for Every** Campus (EC4EC)'s emergency contraception distribution training and have received a large supply of free emergency contraception to distribute to the Long Beach and campus community. Every other Monday, WGSSSA tables in a high traffic area on campus to give out supplies like emergency contraceptives, condoms, dental dams, lube, pregnancy and ovulation tests, and more to students, staff, and faculty. Additionally, we hold all these supplies in the newly renovated space in the WGSS Department Office, so students may stop by and pick up necessary supplies when needed.

"We look forward to continuing the growth of the organization and supporting the department community." -WGSSSA Board WGSSSA is also proud to have joined CSULB's Students for Quality Education, La FUERZA, and various other CSU student organizations from different regions in a rally against tuition hikes. As reproductive justice advocates, we have identified this tuition increase as a reproductive health and justice issue. By forcing students to pay more for their education each semester, many lowincome students and students who do not receive aid will be faced with the difficult decision between meeting their basic needs and paying for their education. We demand a rollback on the multi-year tuition increase immediately.


# WGSS 490: FEMINIST ORGANIZING, RADICAL VISIONS, AND TRANSFORMATIVE JUSTICE IN A TRANSNATIONAL WORLD



#### Curriculum Spotlight

In Spring 2024, Dr. Basarudin taught WGSS 490: Feminist Organizing, Radical Visions, and Transformative Justice in a Transnational World. The course explored intellectual, social, and creative dimensions of contemporary feminist organizing and mobilization in a transnational context.

The course focused on the interventions and contributions that radical feminist praxis generates across borders, identities, and subjectivities to engage intersectional work of societal and structural change. The students of WGSS 490 participated in feminist organizing by collaborating with faculty and staff on the Transnational Feminist Solidarities Conference.



#### WGSS 424: GENDERING **ENVIRONMENTAL** JUSTICE

### Curriculum Spotlight



Every Spring semester, our department offers WGSS 424: Gendering Environmental Justice, taught by Dr. Lori Baralt. This upper division course is open to all student but is often taken by for understanding environmental issues. The WGSS and Environmental Science and Policy students. The course critically analyzes the ways in which gender, race, class, and other structural inequalities shape environmental injustices as well as alternatives for an environmentally just future.

WGSS students were invited to listen to a panel of alumni speak about their experiences in a variety of graduate programs.



Congratulations to **Dr. Azza Basarudin** on her early tenure and promotion to Associate Professor. Dr. Basarudin joined WGSS in Fall 2020 after teaching and holding visiting positions at UCLA, CSUN, Cerritos College, Harvard Divinity School, Syracuse University, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, Universiti Sains Malaysia, and the American University in Cairo. Her research and teaching interests are transnational feminisms, Muslim cultures and societies, feminist movements, and human rights, emphasizing Southeast Asia. We greatly appreciate Dr. Basarudin's teaching, research, and service, which have strengthened our department and campus community.

Congratulations to **Dr. Lori Baralt** on her promotion to full professor. Dr. Baralt joined the WGSS department in 2009 after earning her PhD in Sociology with an emphasis in feminist sociology, health, and social movements and a certificate in Gender, Justice, and Environmental Change from Michigan State University. She regularly teaches courses on gender, sexuality and the body, reproductive justice, and environmental justice. Her most recent research focused on faculty caregiving during the COVID pandemic and pedagogical approaches to teaching reproductive justice and interdisciplinary upper division courses. She is beginning her second 3-year term as WGSS Department Chair this year.

## FACULTY RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT



Dr. Stacy I. Macias

Dr. Stacy Macias has returned to teaching in the WGSS department after a year of conducting multiple research projects that focused on the racialized queerness of Latina/x femmes and femininity. Since her return to teaching, Dr. Macias has continued to produce research and co-author multiple publications in the *Journal of Lesbian Studies*. In Fall 2023, Dr. Macias integrated her research into her special topics course, WGSS 490: Jotería Studies-Queer Gender and Sexuality in the Americas, which explores the emergent and dynamic interdisciplinary field of Jotería Studies in which "brown" racialized sexualities and genders serve as both the primary subjects of analysis and main methods of reading.

Dr. Melissa Hidalgo is currently a WGSS lecturer whose research interests and areas of expertise include Chicana/ox-Latina/o/x literatures, 19th and 20th-century U.S. cultural studies, and queer and feminist cultural production. Dr. Hidalgo has written for a variety of popular publications, including the Los Angeles Times, New York Times, KCET.org, Boom California, and L.A. Taco. In Spring 2024, Dr. Hidalgo co-hosted a podcast episode titled, "From Potatoes to Tacos: How Mexican Food is Making Waves in Ireland," under the Curious Broadcast Podcast. The episode spotlights the multicultural history of food in Ireland, with a focus on the emerging Mexican food scene in Dublin and beyond. You can listen to Dr. Hidalgo's episode here.


#### WGSS GRADUATE AWARDEES

Since 2012, the WGSS department has awarded three departmental awards to graduating students. This year, the WGSS department awarded two students per award. Congrats award recipients of the 2023/2024 academic year!

### bell hooks Transforming Lives Award Recipients

This award honors a graduating student who has demonstrated perseverance to accomplish a transformational, educational goal. An acclaimed feminist writer and prolific cultural critic, bell hooks is best known for exploring the interlocking connections among race, class, gender, and culture. Such work challenged feminist thinkers and activists to theorize gender oppression in the context of other critical social factors like class and race.





#### Dolores Huerta Activism Award Recipients

This award honors a graduating student who has demonstrated a serious commitment to feminist activism and social justice. Noted labor leader and civil rights activist, Dolores Huerta, co-founded the United Farm Workers with Cesar Chavez. Huerta has been an activist her entire life; her participation in non-violent civil disobedience has led to 22 arrests, while her commitment to progressive causes has earned her numerous awards such as the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor.



## Sharon Sievers Scholarly Achievement Award Recipients

This award honors a graduating student who has demonstrated an exceptional engagement with the field of WGSS through a culminating research project. Sharon Sievers was a noted specialist in Japanese History and a feminist leader on the CSULB campus for 40 years. She co-founded the WGSS department and defended it in a legal suit against the university when antifeminist forces attempted to shut it down.
