## RANGE OF SANCTIONS

The range of sanctions that could result from your conduct include educational sanctions, denial of access, restitution, loss of financial aid, probation, suspension, expulsion, or some combination thereof.

- Educational and Remedial Sanctions. Assignments, such as work, research, essays, service to the University or the community, training, counseling, removal from participation in recognized student clubs and organizations (e.g., fraternities and sororities), and/or University events, or other remedies intended to discourage similar misconduct or as deemed appropriate based upon the nature of the violation.
- Denial of Access to Campus or Persons. A designated period of time during which the Student is not permitted5 (i) on University Property or specified areas of Campus6 or (ii) to have contact (physical or otherwise) with the Complainant, witnesses or other specified persons.
- Restitution. Compensation for loss, damages, or injury. This may include appropriate service and/or monetary material replacement.
- Disciplinary Probation. A designated period of time during which privileges of continuing in S tudent status are conditioned upon future behavior. Conditions may include the potential loss of specified privileges to which a current S tudent would otherwise be entitled, or the probability of more severe disciplinary sanctions if the S tudent is found to violate the S tudent Conduct Code or any University policy during the probationary period.
- Suspension. Temporary separation of the Student from active Student status or Student status.
- A S tudent who is suspended for less than one academic year shall be placed on inactive S tudent (or equivalent) status (subject to individual Campus policies) and remains eligible to re-enroll at the University (subject to individual Campus enrollment policies) once the suspension has been served. Conditions for re-enrollment may be specified.
- A S tudent who is suspended for one academic year or more shall be separated from S tudent status but remains eligible to reapply to the University (subject to individual Campus application polices) once the suspension has been served. Conditions for readmission may be specified.
- Suspension of one academic year or more, withdrawals in lieu of suspension, and withdrawals with pending misconduct investigations or disciplinary proceedings shall be entered on the S tudent<s transcript permanently without exception6 this requirement shall not be waived in connection with a resolution agreement.
- Expulsion. Permanent separation of the S tudent from S tudent status from the California S tate University system. Expulsion, withdrawal in lieu of expulsion, and withdrawal with pending misconduct investigation or disciplinary proceeding shall be entered on the S tudent<s transcript permanently, without exception6 this requirement shall not be waived in connection with a resolution agreement.

Additional Remedies can include measures to protect the complainant and/or the campus community.
