  - 6.2 Report from CFA Long Beach Co-President Shelly Collins- SC presents on bargaining which begins this semester. January 23rd will be a briefing on the current state of the budget. Strike fund committee has been formed. Thank you to the Provost for the statement on ICE/Immigration enforcement. Awaiting confirmation on Beach alerts will be used for ICE on campus. Budget proposal was released with tentative good news. January 27<sup>th</sup> BOT meeting will announce new CSULB President, public comment requests made by CFA. February 6<sup>th</sup> will be spring kickoff, with meetings after this date. S. Derakhshan commented on the Iranian students who are suffering in the deadliest protests in years, with an internet blackout. Due to the lack of transparency, at least 15-40,000 deaths have occurred. He called for a message of support highlighting available resources to students affected on our campus. SC will work on crafting a statement of solidarity. NS asked if languages were required, and the answer was no. A. Kahn moves to waive first reading, moved and seconded. Vote on motion, yes-93% no-7%. Vote on entire proposal, yes-98% no-2%. **Proposal passes.**

Vote on entire policy, yes-48 no-6. **Policy approved**, move to Charge now. Move to charge document, line 1, CM amendment, change language. Approved by acclamation. CM amendment, bullet 5, replace language, moved and seconded. Approved by acclamation. *Stop at this point.*
