Foreign Language Requirement - Students can complete the foreign language requirement by completing at least 3 UNITS of a second language taken at the 200-level at CSULB or equivalent at another institution. Courses include ARAB 201B, 250; ASLD 202; CHIN 202; FIL 202; FREN 200, 201, 201B; GERM 201B; ITAL 200, 201, 201B; JAPN 202; KHMR 201; KOR 202; SPAN 200, 201B, 250; VIET 211. Students may also demonstrate 2nd-year level proficiency in a second language, subject to approval by the Global Studies advisor.

In order to graduate from CSULB, students must complete General Education/GWAR/Major requirements and have a minimum of 120 units (40 must be upper division) with at least a 2.0 in all GPAs (Overall, CSULB, Major).
