- A course can only be used to satisfy one major requirement. **Double counting is not allowed within the major.**
- Students must achieve intermediate competency in Italian, equivalent to either ITAL 200, ITAL 201, or ITAL 201B prior to enrolling in upper division coursework.
- Consult with the undergraduate advisor regarding demonstration of existing language competency.
- Native speakers of Italian may not enroll in ITAL 100A/B, 101A/B, ITAL 200, or 201A/B.
- Students are strongly encouraged to study abroad in Italy. Students may find internships at Italian and Italian-American institutions in the Long Beach area.
- Candidates who intend to teach Italian language are required to take ITAL 414.
- **Students wishing to pursue the Single Subject Credential in Languages Other Than English (LOTE) in addition to the major must see the undergraduate Italian Advisor and LOTE Credential advisor as many classes can count for the major, for GE, and for the credential.**
