International Student Responsibility Pledge

F-1 and J-1 students are authorized to pursue a full course of study towards specific educational or professional objectives at approved U.S. academic institutions. Once your academic objectives have been met, the U.S. government expects that you intend to return to your residence abroad. When you enter the U.S., you accept responsibility to abide by the conditions of your F-1 or J-1 student status. Failure to maintain lawful status can result in serious penalties. KEY IMMIGRATION DOCUMENTS

Form I-20, "Certificate of Eligibility": The CSULB Form I-20 is issued by our institution to document a student's eligibility to attend a specific academic program. This form must be presented to the U.S. consulate abroad to apply for a visa and to immigration officials upon each entry to the U.S. Any changes to your academic program (academic dates, major, degree level, funding, etc.) must be reflected on your I-20. You must keep *all* I-20s issued during your studies for future reference.

F-1 Form I-20 Travel signature from a DSO is valid for one year for current students and 6 months for OPT students.

Passport: The passport must be valid at all times during your stay in the U.S. and must be valid at least 6 months into the future when entering the U.S., applying for a visa, or filing any other forms to USCIS. The passport is usually renewable through your home country's embassy in the U.S.

F-1 Student Visa: This stamp in your passport permits you to enter the U.S. in the appropriate F-1 status. The visa may expire while you are in the U.S. and can only be renewed at a U.S. consulate or embassy abroad. If you travel after your visa expires, you must renew your F-1 Visa before reentry. Short-term travel to Canada, Mexico, & nearby islands may be permitted with an expired visa when eligible for a visa revalidation.

The Form I-797 Notice of approval for F-1 status *does not* replace the requirement for a valid F-1 visa to re-enter the U.S. after traveling abroad.

I-94 Record: This online record shows your valid entry to the U.S. and grants permission to remain in the authorized status for a specified period of time. You will need to file for an *Extension of Stay (EOS)* before your *Admit Until Date* expires if additional time is needed to complete a program of study, begin a new program of study, or engage in post-completion optional practical training (OPT) or STEM OPT. The I-94 details will change with any future [travel and re-entry](#).

MAINTAINING VALID IMMIGRATION STATUS

- Maintain a valid passport, with an expiration date at least 6 months into the future always.
- Attend the school whose name appears on your I-20 and make normal academic progress towards your degree.
- Register full-time every academic term through the completion of your studies.
- Comply with in-person instruction requirements, only 3 online units can be used towards your full-time registration requirements as listed in our homepage [F-1 Rules | California State University Long Beach](#)
- Maintain a valid I-20. Apply for an extension of your program end date if more time will be needed to graduate.
- [Obtain a travel signature](#) on your I-20 from the DSO each year or before you [travel outside the U.S.](#)
- Maintain U.S. health insurance for you and your dependents.
- [Contact the ISS Office](#) to report a change in your immigration status or changes to your academic plan.
- Maintain accurate contact information in your CSULB Student Center
- Report all changes to your academic plan, visa status and contact information within 10 days from the change.
- Never engage in paid or unpaid off-campus training without proper authorization from an ISS Advisor.
- Never work more than 20 hours per week on campus while school is in session.
- Never take a leave of absence or drop below full-time registration without authorization from the ISS Advisor
- Never violate federal regulations including engaging in illegal drug use and/or crime.
- Complete required tax reporting each year.
- Obey all relevant grace periods following degree completion, academic withdrawal, or program termination.

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
