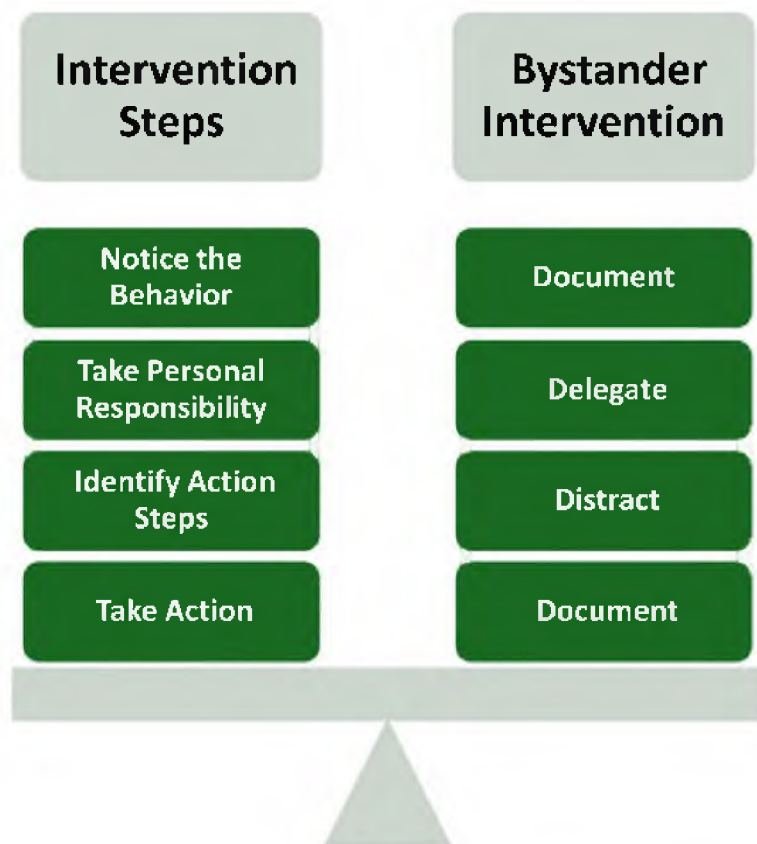

Bystander Intervention



Direct: Directly engaging and asking a person committing sexual misconduct to stop their behavior.

Distract: Creating a diversion that causes the violent behavior to stop.

Delegate: Assigning someone else to intervene or gathering others to help you intervene.

Document: Save screenshots, emails, texts, videos, etc. for a friend.

Affirmative Consent



In California: Cannot consent if under 18 years of age.

Only individuals 18 years of age or older can legally give affirmative consent.
