- Writing sample: please submit a paper, report, or mapping project that you feel best showcases your research and writing abilities and potential. Links to other material, if any, may be embedded in your document.
- Two Letters of Reference: Names & Email addresses of two recommending CSULB faculty members.

Background: The blended program is intended to streamline access to our MA degree program for qualified and promising undergraduates. A maximum of 12 units may be double-counted as part of the BA degree and the MA degree. These courses must be taken at the 500-level for those that are cross-listed as 400/500-level courses. Excluded courses include all GEOG 600-level courses. GEOG 596 and GEOG 696 may be included as an elective with senior status and Graduate Advisor Consent.

Review Process: Within 30 calendar days of the application deadline, no fewer than two faculty from the Master's Program will review applications, render decisions, notify the applicants, and when applicable, inform Enrollment Services via the Advisor Request System.
