Position Description: The Recreation & Leisure Studies Department invites applications for a full-time Lecturer to teach courses in the Outdoor Recreation & Tourism concentration of the BA in Recreation, as well as core Recreation Management courses. The successful candidate will bring a blend of industry and academic experience and will play a key role in growing the concentration by developing and maintaining partnerships with Southern California outdoor recreation and tourism industry organizations to support student internships, applied projects, and enhanced career pathways.

- MA/MS in Recreation Management, Outdoor Recreation, Travel, Tourism or related discipline {Candidates working toward completion of a master's degree will be considered as long as official notification of completion of the master's degree can be provided by August 1, 2026 (for Fall semester start) or January 1, 2027 (for Spring semester start)}
- Demonstrated potential for excellence in Teaching
- Demonstrated commitment to working successfully with a diverse student population
- Specialization in Outdoor Recreation, Travel, Tourism.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Demonstrated experience in teaching or training excellence at the college or professional level
- Experience working successfully with a diverse student population
- Demonstrated commitment to/experience of student mentorship
- At least two years of related professional work experience (Outdoor Recreation/Travel and Tourism)

Duties:

- Teach undergraduate and graduate courses in Outdoor Recreation, Resource Management, Tourism, Social Media Marketing, Sustainability. Mode of instruction is primarily in-person, but may include online or hybrid courses.
- Develop relationships with internal and external partners to further expand student opportunities in Outdoor Recreation, Travel and Tourism industry.
- Participate in service to the Department, College, University, Profession, and Community
