6 **Rights and Privileges of Emeritus Faculty and Presidents**

7 (This supersedes policy statement 70-9)

8
9 This policy was recommended by the Academic Senate on February 24, 2005 and
10 approved by the President on March 21, 2005.

11
12 All faculty including lecturers who have accumulated ten or more years of full-time
13 equivalent service at California State University, Long Beach shall achieve Emeritus
14 status in their highest academic rank upon retirement from the University. Breaks in
15 service do not disqualify a lecturer from attaining Emeritus status. Emeritus status may
16 also be granted by the President, acting upon the recommendation of the appropriate
17 department, college, or equivalent unit. Presidents shall achieve Emeritus status upon
18 retirement from the University.

19 Upon becoming Emeritus, faculty members or presidents:

- 20 1. Shall receive a faculty identification card entitling them to the usual attendant
21 privileges.
- 22 2. Shall be listed in the University catalogue under their appropriate department.
- 23 3. Shall receive a letter of congratulations from the President of the University.
- 24 4. Shall be invited to all formal functions sanctioned and/or approved by the University.
- 25 5. Shall be eligible to participate in sponsored research projects subject to appropriate
26 university approval.
- 27 6. Shall be eligible to serve on thesis committees.
- 28 7. Shall be eligible to use office and/or laboratory space if available and approved by
29 2/3rds of the faculty of the relevant department(s).
- 30 8. Shall be extended at least the following rights and privileges, where applicable and
31 subject to university guidelines:

32 A. Internet access and/or an e-mail account.

33 B. Discounts or complimentary tickets for campus events.

C. Full faculty library privileges.

D. Eligibility for free faculty parking, if not actively employed by the University.

E. Eligibility to use recreational facilities.

F. Other privileges as the Academic Senate, Associated Students, the President and/or the Chancellor's Office may recommend.

9. Upon retirement any faculty member may decline Emeritus status.
