The following policy was recommended by the Academic Senate at its meeting of May 14, 1985 and received concurrence of the President, on May 31, 1985.

SUBJECT: MILITARY SCIENCE PROGRAM - ARMY RESERVE OFFICER TRAINING CORPS (AROTC)

The purpose of the baccalaureate-level instruction is the preparation of officers in the armed forces of the United States.

The Military Science Program assigned to the School of Applied Arts and Sciences is conducted by the Army Training Corps detachment assigned to the University pursuant to an agreement between the University and the Department of the Army. The officer in charge, the Army Reserve Officer Training Corps Professor, Military Science, together with other faculty members assigned to provide instruction in the Military Science Program of the School of Applied Arts and Sciences.

The Military Science Program consists of a defined aggregate of baccalaureate-level courses. Science courses are open to students within assigned facilities and providing that is reserved for students participating in the AROTC, intend to apply for the forces of the United States upon completion of the baccalaureate degree.

The terms and conditions of acceptance into the AROTC are of a mutual nature between the student and the Department of the Army. The University makes no representations and assumes no responsibilities with respect thereto.

The program of courses offered in the Military Science Program shall exceed nineteen (19) semester units. These units be counted toward the degree, and, if necessary, be counted beyond the unit requirements for the degree. The program of courses shall be in addition to, all other specified military requirements for the degrees including the major or major option, a minor, - General Education course requirement: special University course requirement and courses specifically required of individual, the result of language or mathematics examination. The Courses of the Military Science Program. are subject to the review procedures governing all undergraduate, courses. The courses, constituting the

Program shall be subject to the following special review: each course shall be reviewed for evidence of duplication of content with the analogous course in the Aerospace Studies Program (AFROTC) and for the possibility of combining courses to avoid unnecessary course duplication. The Military Science Program shall be subject to the standard Program Review on a five year cycle.
