4 **Policy For A Smoke-Free Campus Environment**

5 This policy was approved by the Academic Senate on May 11, 1989 and approved by the
6 President on June 1, 1989.

7 California State University, Long Beach has a responsibility to provide employees and
8 students with a safe working and learning environment. Given the fact that smoking is the
9 most significant cause of premature and preventable death in the United States today,
10 California State University, Long Beach is declared to be a "smoke-free" campus in
11 accordance with the Governor's Executive Order D-62-87, Government Section 19262.

12 Effective with the first day of the fall 1989 semester, this "smoke-free" policy shall apply
13 to all state-owned and University operated facilities regardless of location. This policy does
14 not include public performances in which smoking is an integral and necessary part of those
15 performances. Smoking is prohibited in all indoor areas, including but not limited to:

16 administrative Offices	theatres	waiting rooms
17 private offices	lobbies	reception areas
18 laboratories	hallways	university vehicles
19 classrooms	stairwells	machine shops
20 conference rooms	restrooms	elevators
21 auditoria	libraries	food service areas

23 Where outdoor seating is provided adjacent to indoor food service facilities, non-smoking
24 sections must be designed and posted.

25 The success of this policy depend upon the thoughtfulness, consideration, and
26 cooperation of everyone. All share in the responsibility for adhering to and enforcing this
27 policy. Any problems should be brought to the attention of the appropriate supervisor
28 and/or department chair. If a problem cannot be resolved in this manner, recourse may be
29 had by contacting the appropriate Dean, Director, or Faculty and Staff Relations
30 Coordinator. There shall be no reprisal against anyone seeking assistance in enforcing this
31 policy.

32 For those employees and students who wish to stop smoking, California State
33 University, Long Beach shall support and assist their efforts by providing referrals to
34 cessation programs. The Employee Assistance Program at the Student Health Center may
35 be contacted for information and assistance. The Employee Assistance Coordinator may be
36 reached by calling extension 4771.
