### 8:45 a.m. Time Certain: Guest Speaker – Penni Wells

- -Here to talk about our staff and family discount for select non-credit programs
- -Employees receive a 30% discount, immediate family member receive a 15% discount (same as the alumni discount offered to all CSULB alums)
  - -You can try to get your department to pay for it! Some may do so
- -CPIE fact 1: The new CPIE building is a green-building, completely self-sustainable. Wander over and check it out!
- -CPIE fact 2: CPIE staff did not move offices over there, we are still at FND. The CPIE building is for classrooms
  - -Q: When are most classes scheduled?
- -A: Most classes are in the evening, in the CPIE or FND building. Some Saturdays, some 6-9pm classes, etc.

### 9:00 a.m. Time Certain: President Jane Conoley

-Meeting in Sacramento about Graduation Initiative – we were picked out as an example of success. 73% of students graduate in 6 years (up from 39% at the beginning of the initiative)

- -GO bond is thru legislature and going in front of the voters. If passed, \$2 billion dollars would come to us as a system to handle deferred maintenance. Very important for our campus and our infrastructure
  - -We have received \$12 million dollars to improve funding for childcare
- -Next week the Supreme Court will hear the DACA case and a case that impacts the LGBT+ community. Our campus is monitoring these two cases closely
- -New security measures at the Chancellors Office because various employees of the CSU (including Trustees and Presidents) have received threats
- -Excited to see Homecoming this year as things have changed a little bit this year, activities beginning at 12pm! There is a cost for parking this year
- -Have been working on locks around the university, by this time next year every instructional space will have locks. Full-time locksmith has been hired
- -Decals have been piloted for campus community members coming here on wheels (skateboards, for example) walk vs. wheel paths –will begin the decals around winter break
- -Q: Will staff offices receive locks? Our office has electronic locks that lock outside the door
- -A: Campus planning has presented many nuances. Do contact Michael Gardner on case-by-case situations
