The Coordinator of American Indian Student Services provides the following services in support of the recruitment, retention, and graduation of AI/AN students enrolled at CSULB:

- Plan and implement outreach activities directed towards assisting in the identification and admission of prospective AI/AN students.
- Monitor and assist in the processing of financial aid and Bureau of Indian Affairs grants for eligible AI/AN students.
- Provide admissions, academic and personal advising and counseling support for AI/AN students enrolled at CSULB.
- Serve as the Student Life and Development advisor to AI/AN student organizations.
- Serve as a liaison to campus offices on AI/AN concerns.
- Lead the California State University (CSU) Chancellor's Native American Initiative to increase the number of admitted and graduating students from Tribal Nations at CSULB.
- Coordinate advising with Educational Equity programs.
- Maintain an American Indian events information center and calendar.
- Coordinate the Puvungna Cultural Student Resource Center for activities and meetings located at the University Student Union (USU) room 310.
- Co-Advise the American Indian Student Council in planning the annual CSU Puvungna Pow Wow held on the second weekend in March.
- Coordinate the Annual American Indian Graduation Celebration.
