### The survey focused on the climate of diversity, including experiences with discrimination, cross-racial interactions, validation and a sense of belonging.





**Staff Climate Survey** 

The survey provided staff and administrators an opportunity to share issues surrounding relational dynamics and institutional complexities including the climate related to diversity, general satisfaction with working conditions and factors that contribute to staff engagement.



#### **Faculty Survey**

The survey asked faculty about their pedagogical practices, goals and expectations for students, research and service activities, sources of stress and satisfaction, and the connection between learning in the classroom and practices in the local and global community.

All surveys were administered during the Spring 2020 term.
