

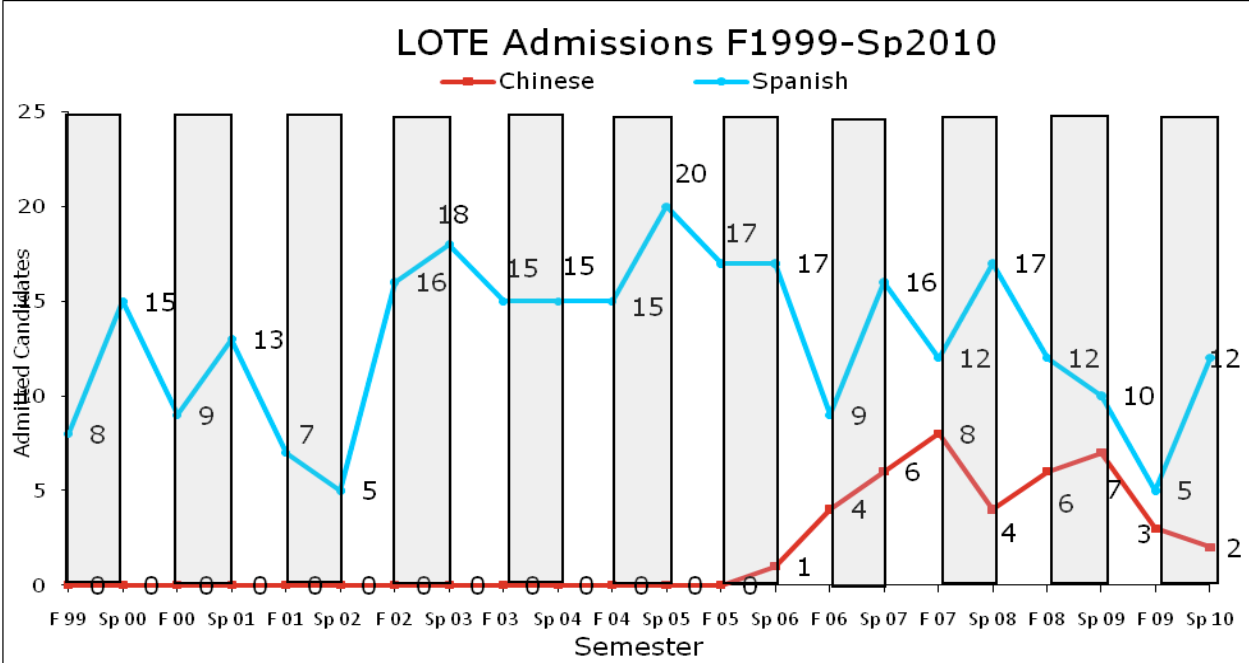

LOTE Admissions Report:

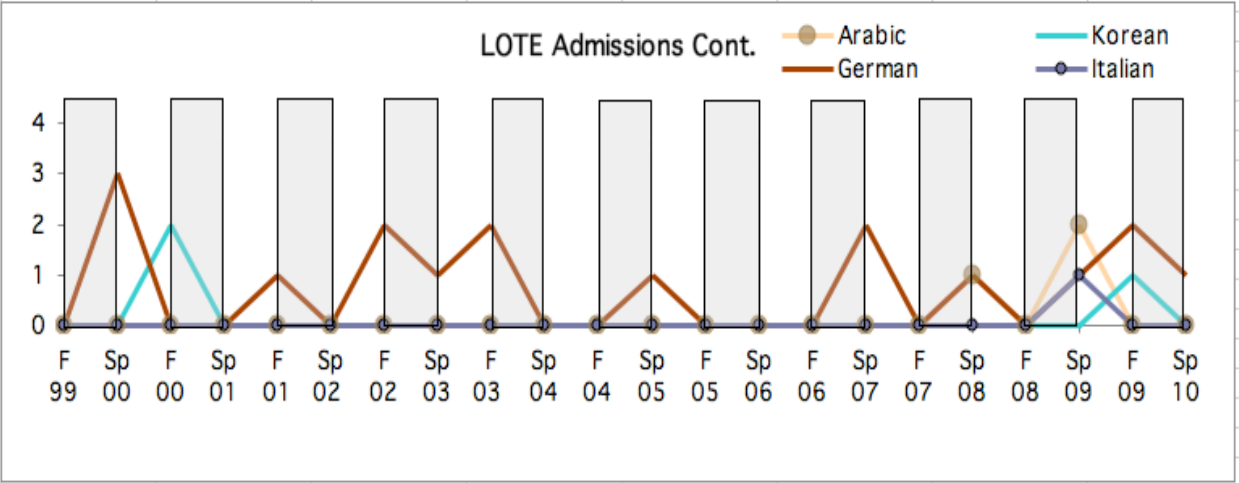
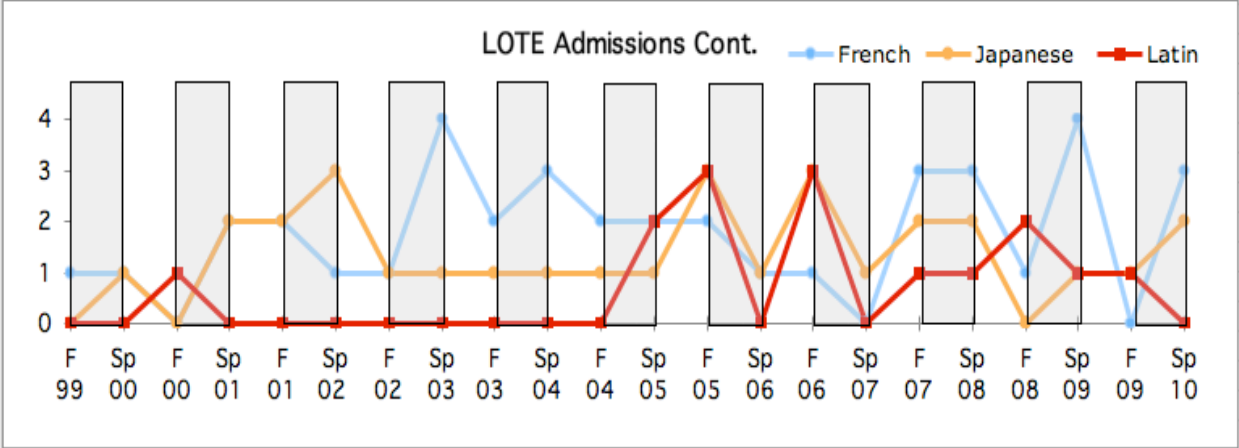
LOTE's nine languages require collaboration with three departments: 1) **RGRLL** (Arabic, French, German, Italian, and Spanish); 2) **Asian and Asian American Studies** (Chinese, Korean, and Japanese); 3) **Classics** (Latin), involving students interested in becoming public secondary school teachers. French, German, Japanese, and Spanish candidates were the first language groups, beginning academic year 1999-2000. Then Korean and Latin candidates entered fall semester 2000; Chinese candidates first entered spring semester 2006; Arabic and Italian candidates entered spring 2008. In addition, French, Japanese, and Spanish candidates have been admitted all eleven academic years, while German admissions involve nine of the eleven academic years; Latin candidates seven of the eleven academic years; Chinese candidates five of the eleven academic years; Arabic and Korean candidates two of the eleven academic years; Italian candidates one of the eleven academic years. The annual averages in green in the bottom row reflect only those academic years with admissions per language group [Arabic (2 academic years); Chinese (5); French (11); German (9); Italian (1); Japanese (11); Korean (2); Latin (7); Spanish (11)]:

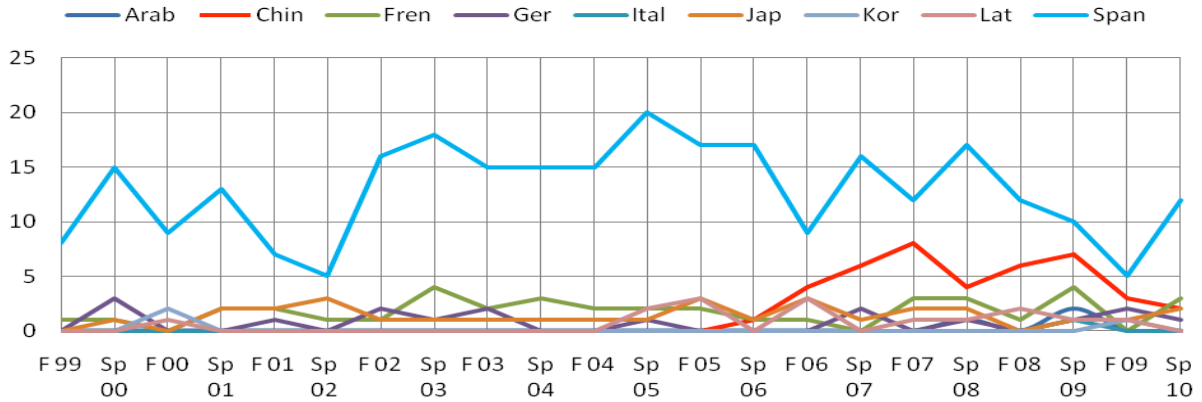


Grey Bars Help Define Academic Years

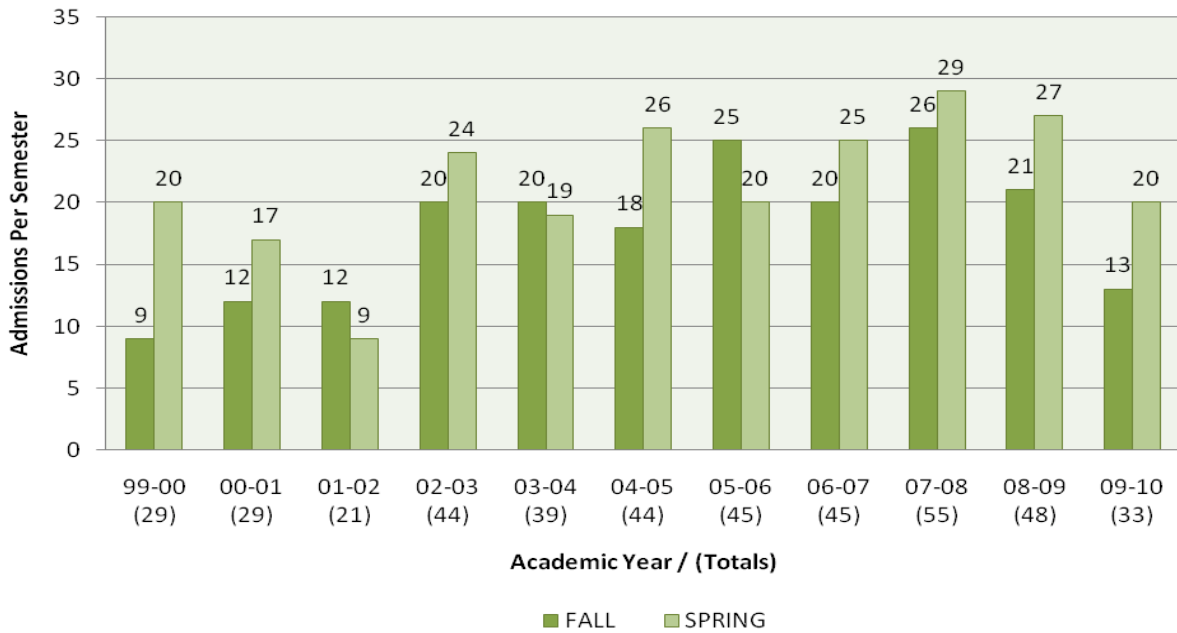

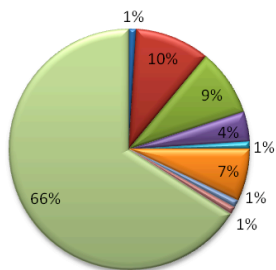

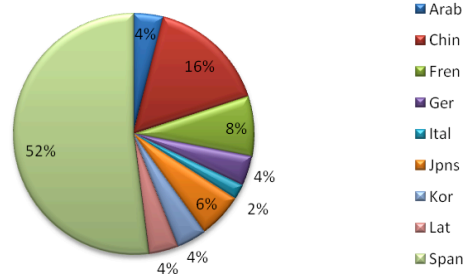
Admissions Across All Languages Spring/Fall 1999-2010



11-Year %



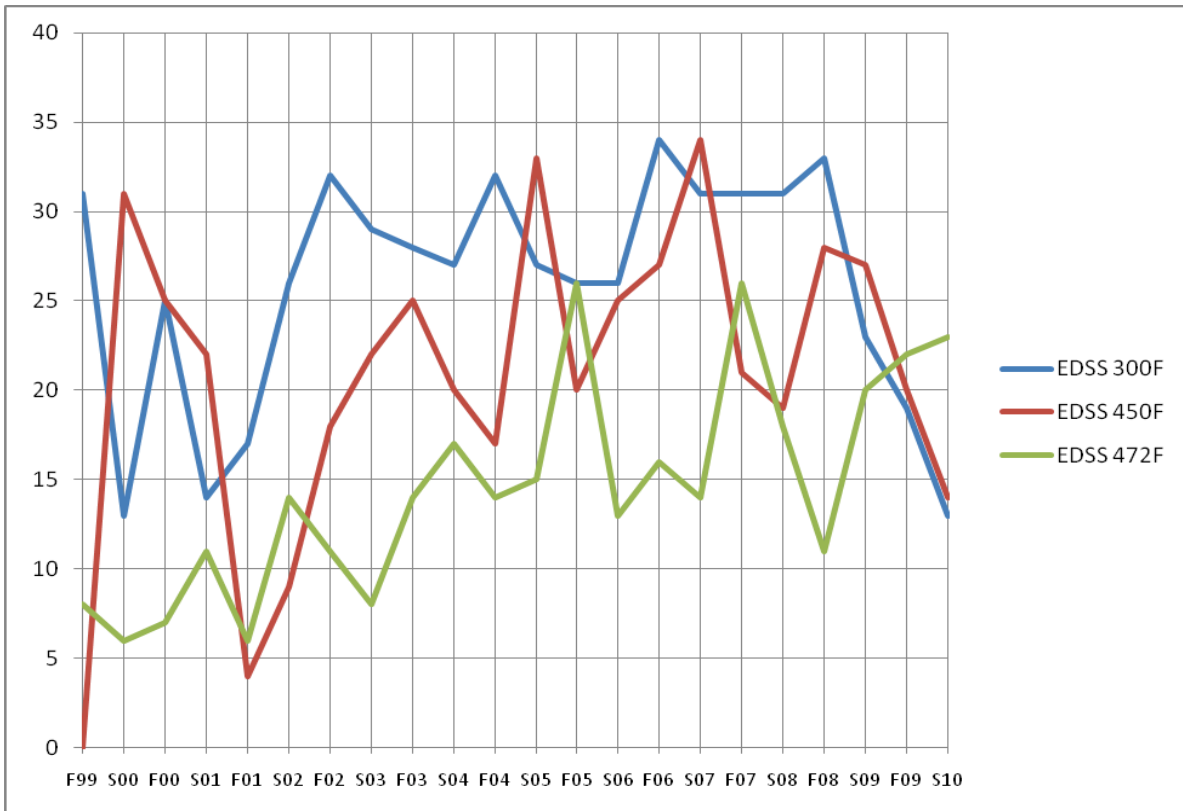
Average per AY %

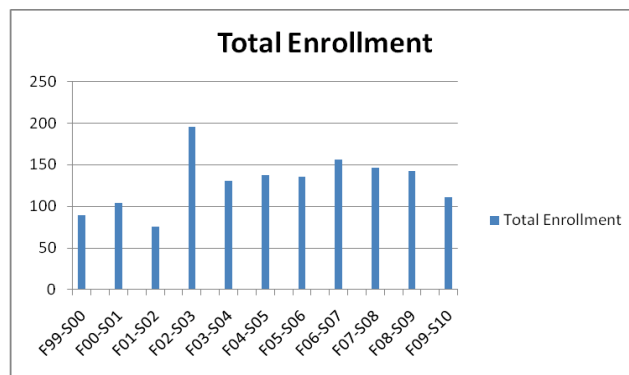

1999-2000:	Total Enrollments	89	=	72%	of Average Annual Enrollment

Conclusions:

LOTE admissions and enrollment totals in our three LOTE courses (EDSS 300F, EDSS 450F, EDSS 472F) indicate a recent dip (e.g., LOTE Admissions, 2008-2009, being 48 candidates compared to 33 admissions in 2009-2010), with a similar fall in total LOTE enrollments, (e.g., 142 candidates in 2008-2009, compared to 111 candidates in 2009-2010); however, this rise and fall might be explained by fluctuations the last five years in Chinese admissions, for which the average for 2005-2010 had been 8 admissions per academic year, whereas most recent Chinese admissions have fallen (only 5 in 2009-2010 and only one potential admit for F10). Despite this specific drop in Chinese candidates, the total of LOTE enrollees during academic year 2009-2010 was a respectable 111, a healthy 90% of the Average Annual Enrollment over eleven years, 1999-2010. On the other hand, the highest enrollment ever in the program predates the admission of Chinese, Arabic, and Italian candidates, back in 2002-2003, with a total of 196 enrollees, 159% of the Average Annual Enrollment, an unusual spike in the records.
