Specific Services Offered:

Pre-Admission – we provide information and advisement to students as they consider and apply to programs.

Admission – we review applications, calculate grade point averages, provide data and files to faculty, input admission decisions into the University's PeopleSoft system, and provide admission documents to students selected for admission.

Orientation – we provide each incoming student with a folder of necessary forms and documents required to progress through the program as part of an orientation presentation.

Program Completion – we maintain student records, assist students with procedural advisement and process requests to advance to candidacy

Exit requirements – we administer comprehensive examinations, and issue registration permits for thesis or project courses as well as maintain committee records and liaison with the Thesis Office. We report comprehensive examination reports to Enrollment Services and facilitate final grade reporting for Thesis and Project.

Graduation – we provide verification of requirements to Enrollment Services and troubleshoot any issues preventing graduation.

Committee Support – we provide staff support to the Graduate Committee and the College Curriculum Committee. We forward all approved curricular changes to the University Curriculum Office and provide oversight for edit changes to the College of Education catalog pages. We also provide support to the committee charged with reviewing applications for SCAC awards (Scholarly and Creative Activity).
