FPPC met the first and third Friday of each month during the academic year. Here are the council's main accomplishments:

- Extensive changes to 12-06 Policy on Faculty Awards. FPPC made changes to sections regrading the Legacy Lecturer, Distinguished Faculty Teaching award, and added a faculty service recognition award.
- Additional changes to 12-06 Policy on Faculty Awards. The Academic Senate's
 Executive Committee requested further (new) policy additions, merging
 modified versions of ORSP awards into current policy. After consulting with the
 chair of the University Awards Committee, FPPC's changes resulted in new
 categories to existing awards.
- Revised University Mini-Grant and Summer Stipend Committee charge and duties.
- Created new policy for Selection and Term of Office for Representative to the California State University Academic Council for International Programs.
- Revised 08-15 Policy on Range Elevation for Lecturers regarding review periods and evaluation criteria.

In addition to these major activities, the council also engaged in lengthy discussion regarding potential and/or anticipated changes to the Policy on Student Evaluations and the Equity and Diversity statement (completed by job applicants). The council encourages colleges to recruit eligible faculty interested in and able to serve on our collegial, productive council.
