 - It was recommend by Academic Senate to change from 48 – 49 to 42 units as they want to integrate GR into GE
 - Tiffini received a letter from CSUN as they are doing a vote of no confidence against the Chancellors office against EO 1100. However, this does not affect our GE Policy
 - Danny mentioned CEPC have a deadline of making final recommendation for GR e.g. HD and will be 2 hours for discussion
 - He also mentioned that senate wise the policy is going pretty well so far regarding the general education requirements that were approved
 - It is being suggested that we also review the eligibility or credence instructors with “disciplinary expertise” such as a Ph.D., Grad School Work or Significant Teaching experiences
 - When we are looking at the course proposal we just need to cut out the ambiguous language, which is a workflow issue due to Curriculog. Does not have to mention in GEAR form and SCO simultaneously in other words.

 - It was recommended that the interdisciplinary should be a primary category, move check mark from secondary to primary
 - It was not clear that the was enough historical information in the course content or to reading list
 - Add the GEAR requirement to the GEAR
 - Remove the secondary skill in interdisciplinary

- The assignments will be based on fictional books and add the ones that have the 5 stars in the math data based and the content will be a 1/3 of the content
- The proposal is missing WI and GL and not checked on the GEAR/Put them back

- This was on the Agenda and updated GEAR form and reviewed by the previous exec 2017 -2018 committee
- The proposal is not written in the format that we are not used to and therefore the proposal is missing a lot of important information
- A member is curious that the course is mainly for majors and not for anyone and will need a pre req and cannot proceed because its integrative
- Problem is that by university to policy professors have a right to change course content but there is also a policy for GE and needs to be abided by and therefore the GE category must be included – Creativity and Discovery and WI and relevant 3 things and how they apply to the course will make it a better proposal.
- We have to ask the faculty to write the SCO in the standard way that is to be completed
- The proposal just needs to be more explicit in the primary skills that have to be addressed regarding the alignment of the SLOs and the essential skills
- Unfortunately do to the required changes and time restrictions, this course will not make it to the Fall catalog
- Motion (M) to approve for approval and seconded (S)
- **Vote:** Come back to the committee for full review 7 or Exec 6 – back to committee. Therefore based on the majority it would have to be reviewed by the GE committee

- The proposal would have to be revised to fit that category
- The WI will be unchecked but it is integrative
- It was recommended to add the pre req language to the GEAR
- One of the outcome WI and covered Critical Thinking and therefore needs to be separated e.g. SLO #1 - some of the skills are CT and WI so they need to be separated - the writing was clear but the CT was a blur

- Label the major essential skills being covered because it was not done uniformly in the proposal – maybe mislabeled?
- The outcomes are measurable but the SLOs are written in a way that is not easily distinguishable but must clear state that its doing both of these skills
- The language just have to be explicit to indicate both measures
- The C2 category is not really explicit in the SCO as mentioned by a member and thinks it needs to be clear in the justification as it is vague and needs more specificity
- The committee says that the policy is not very clear regarding this category
- Motion **(M)** to approve for approval and seconded **(S)**
- All unanimously approved the proposal with modifications
