RESOURCES

The university requires all students to submit online COVID-19 vaccination certifications. If you have not already done so, please click the chicklet, or log onto **Single Sign-On**, to attest/ certify your COVID-19 vaccination status ASAP.

All students, including online-only students, must access the chiclet below and certify their COVID-19 vaccination status.

Vaccinations are available from Student Health Services on campus for all members of the Beach community on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. Shots are available on a first-come, first-served basis as inventory remains available each day.

COVID - 19 quarantine and symptom information

Per current recommendations, you do not need to quarantine if you are fully vaccinated for COVID-19 and have no symptoms. It is suggested to

monitor your symptoms and test, no sooner than 5 days after exposure. Should any symptoms develop, test immediately. Fully vaccinated individuals can still come to campus but must be diligent with mask use.

You should not come to campus if you are ill.

If you are a student who has tested positive for COVID-19, if you believe you may be positive but have not yet been tested, or if you know of a student who you believe may have contracted COVID-19, please **fill out this form** to notify Student Health Services and prepare to self-quarantine if you are unvaccinated.



It is vital that confirmed or suspected positive cases of COVID-19 are reported as quickly as possible to support health officials in their response.

You can also participate in an <u>online exposure-notification system</u> established by the State of California.

• Grad Slam Competition: 3-minute (pre-recorded) video presentations are available for students whose research is in the *Advanced Stage* (cash awards available).


