4. Introduction of new member: Sarah Shrank: Professor of History, new Director of Grad Studies for College of Liberal Arts

6. PS 14-01 Requirements for Master's Degrees
See: Draft Policy on Master's Degrees
 - a. 1.2.2: L. Portnoi suggested removing deficit-oriented language (e.g., deficiencies). Language is pulled out of Title 5.
J. Cormack: Likes new language, retains intent of message. May add message indicating Title 5 is the basis of this statement.
 - b. 1.2.2A: A. Wright: two semesters vs. one year? J. Canales will confirm.
C. Dunnagan: Students start in summer but aren't officially admitted until fall.
 - c. 2.2: Unless a course has been reserved from undergraduate degree, it should not be included in grad GPA. Some grad advisors use undergrad courses on program of study to boost GPA. We can address this in substitutions or course reserves.
The three GPA labels on transcript do not match policy.
CSULB GPA triggers probation; this is different than the combined GPA. Clarifying this could help students and advisors. Will revisit.
 - d. 2.4: DP: Discussion on campus to change language from probation to notice. (Due to language linked with criminal charge).

- e. 2.5: Added policy 11-02 into 2.5. Changed “400” to “upper-division.” Also, added language to indicate counting of credential or certificate units is at the approval of the degree program and in adherence with PS(x).
- f. 2.6: Policy says academic unit can approve graduation with less than required degrees as long as there are at least 30 units. Currently, this requires an exception (not aligning with policy wording). Do we want to change it?
Jody: Check with ed code to ensure we follow policy.
- g. 2.10.2: Policy on academic load. “Full time” definitions vary (for fees, financial aid, by program, etc.). A. Wright: on student records website: <https://www.csulb.edu/student-records/student-unit-load#:~:text=Full%2Dtime%20enrollment%20during%20the,students%3A%206%20or%20more%20units>. Group favors leaving this language out of the policy and adding to Grad Studies website.
- h. S. Shrank: Language about concurrent credential and Master’s program enrollment would be helpful.
