



Internship Timeline

1 YEAR BEFORE

- Begin researching opportunities ,make note of those you find appealing and their deadlines
- Get involved in activities that can boost your resume
- Step up your networking, attend events and put yourself out there
- Polish a resume and cover letter with support from a professional


6 – 8 MONTHS BEFORE

- Identify potential references, seek out professors, current/past supervisors, and others
- Build a list of target companies you are interested in working for
- Attend professional development events/seminars


3 – 6 MONTHS BEFORE

- Gather and organize materials
 - Resume and Cover Letter
 - Portfolio, Transcripts
 - References and recommendation letters
- Research each company you are applying for beforehand
- Prepare for an interview, practice questions you might get asked
