General national information

There has been a lot of conversation on international education given the war with displaced Ukrainian students and scholars and the various international relations involving China, India, Russia, Australia, etc. How is international education going to be affected? \leftarrow is the question that is being discussed in DC.

It seems that there is a global culture war with the move towards nationalism, autocracy, and the decline of liberal democracy around the world.

It is uncertain/concern whether we will be able to attract Chinese international students similar to how we have done in the past.

We have seen positive changes in the Africa region: there are increasing organizations who are working in international education, the institutions are getting better.

There are many changes happening in DC (White House, State Dept).

Funding has decreased over the years and those who think international ed is important have been lobbying to bring it back to the levels that it used to be.

Question: does this only refer to students and faculty going? Answer: This includes everything, coming, going, Title 6, etc.

Professors around the World (PAW) – the call was posted.

Currently only 1 proposal was submitted and 1 proposal in progress. The deadline was yesterday. Seems that something didn't go well

Several faculty members expressed that they did not receive the information.

Some adjustments to make moving forward

We need to encourage colleagues to apply.

The deadline will be extended to Monday 4/25.

Should we grandfather in previously granted proposals of those who were unable to go due to COVID19?

They will be notified today/tomorrow and they will need to reply by a certain deadline.

We have a committee to review the applications. The committee will need to review by May 6, and the awardees will be informed by the end of the semester.

The PAW program had been suspended for the last two years due to travel complications caused by the pandemic.

The PAW program is offered by the Office of the Provost in conjunction with the Office of the International Education and Global Engagement. The goal of PAW is to strengthen CSULB's global mission and comprehensive campus internationalization initiatives by engaging and supporting faculty travel related to international collaborative research projects, developing or enhancing study or work abroad opportunities for students, and building or strengthening relationships with overseas partner institutions.

Decisions will be made by early May, 2022.

Short term study abroad staff person is leaving our campus for the CO. Someone from CPaCE will be moved to fill this position.

Summer study abroad

300 students signed up for the summer programs. This is fewer than pre-pandemic times but it's more than the past 2 years.

Semester/year-long programs

We have about 100 students going out in the fall.

Open Doors report

We just completed the report for fall 2020-spring 2021. We have 57 students who were abroad during that time (during our peak year we had about 1200 students).

The Florence semester abroad deadline is May 6.
