Description of the Signature Assignment

Students will be asked to conduct a research using quantitative data analysis techniques and to write a research paper, including research questions, literature review, methodology, results, and discussion. The purpose of this assignment is for students to develop skills in writing a research paper. The plan must be typed, spell-checked, double-spaced with a standard 12-point font, and submitted in hard copy. Whenever references are used, they must be properly cited using the American Psychological Association (APA) format.

Directions for Students

A Format for a Research Paper

Chapter I: Introduction (1page)

- 1. Provide an overview of the broad problems in education that lead up to this particular study.
- 2. Purpose of the Study (1/2-1 page)
 - a. Describes what the study will do a direct response to what needs to be known. The research questions are presented here.
- 3. Significance of the Study (1/2 page)
 - a. Describe what contribution to the broad literature or set of broad educational problems would be made when the study is finished.

Chapter II: Literature Review

- 1. Introduction (1/2 page)
 - a. Provide orientation to the purpose and topics of the chapter.
- 2. Synthesizing the literature (2 pages).
- 3. Conclusion (1/2 page)

Chapter III: Methodology

- 1. Introduction (1/2 page)
 - a. Review the purpose and research questions for the study.
- 2. Subjects (1/2 page)
 - a. Provide a detail description of the subjects

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- 3. Instrumentation (1/2-1 page)
 - a. Relation of research questions to instruments.
 - b. Psychometric issues reliability and validity.
- 4. Procedure (1/2-1 page)
 - a. Provide a detail description of the data collection process.
- 5. Data Analysis (1/2 page).

Chapter IV: Results

- 1. Introduction (1/2 page)
- 2. Findings by research questions (1 page)

Chapter V: Discussion/Conclusions/Implications

- 1. Discussion
 - a. Compare and contrast your findings to the literature and explain any possible reasons for discrepancies (1 page)
 - b. "What do the findings mean" is the issue (1 page)
 - c. Limitations and delimitations
 - i. Limitations refer to limitations on the study that are beyond the control of the specific researcher.
 - ii. Delimitations are limitations that the researcher chose to use.
- 2. Conclusions (include future research directions) (1/2 page)
- 3. Implications (1/2 page)

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Scoring Rubric:

Chapter I: Introduction

5-Excellent (Concise and all sections are clearly connected), 4-Good (all sections are addressed in detail),

3-Adequate (Wordy and sections are somewhat disconnected), 2-Poor (missing one or more sections)

Chapter II: Literature Review

5-Excellent (synthesized clearly and research problems/questions are clearly connected to lit), 4-Good (research problems/questions are loosely connect to lit), 3-Adequate (missing some key issues), 2-Poor (summaries, not lit review)

Chapter III: Methodology

5-Excellent (Clearly described and linked to research questions), 4-Good (Enough details to replicate the study), 3-Adequate (methods and research questions are somewhat connected), 2-Poor (missing one or more sections and/or methods and research questions are disconnected)

Chapter IV: Results

5-Excellent (answered all research questions based on statistical analyses), 4-Good (most of the research questions are answered), 3-Adequate (missing some supporting statistical results), 2-Poor (research questions are answered not based on the analyses)

Chapter V: Discussion/Conclusions/Implications

5-Excellent (concise and all sections are clearly described), 4-Good (all sections are addressed in detail), 3-Adequate (Wordy and not clearly connected to previous chapters), 2-Poor (missing one or more sections)
