Leading for Social Justice Moral & Ethical Considerations

Student Learning Outcome(s) Assessed:

SLO #5: Students demonstrate foundational and practical knowledge to incorporate ethical, legal, and professional behaviors to increase equitable educational opportunities and academic achievement for all students.

Description of the Signature Assignment

Candidates will select a social or environmental justice topic (such as disability, gender, race, GLBT issues, animal rights, eco-justice, social class, intelligence, ethics, etc.) and use philosophical theories of social justice to theorize their own position on the topic and to analyze a current policy from the local, state, national, or international perspective.

Directions for Students

Students will select a social or environmental justice topic (such as disability, gender, race, GLBT issues, animal rights, eco-justice, social class, intelligence, etc.) and use social justice theorists such as John Rawls, Robert Nozick or Martha Nussbaum to theorize their own position on the topic and to analyze a current policy from the local, state, national, or international perspective. Students can also use theoretical frameworks such as critical pedagogy, feminist, post-structuralist or other theories to analyze their topic. In consultation with your instructor, students may adapt this assignment to incorporate social justice into their dissertation study.
