• Carbon admissions

- “Just 20 companies have contributed over a third of all carbon emissions since 1965.”
- The biggest problem maker Saudi Aramco gives off enough emissions to be match 6 days worth of modern China
- And how do they get away with it. Its profitable Saudi Aramco made \$304 million daily.
- Even stateside Exxon mobile attempted to lie to their investors on how they affect climate change and our on trial for it.



• Animals in farms

- Currently Fairlife dairy has been having issues from an undercover video of animal abuse
- In these videos that were leaked you can see them hitting and abusing the cows at the biggest dairy farm in its state
- They put hormones in cows now to produce 7 times more than normal and only feed them grain and not grass.



How: “But unless a farm is certified organic — meaning that farmers must abide by strict legal standards when it comes to the care, breeding and feeding of animals — it can be difficult to determine exactly how animals are treated on any property.” (Jackson)

• Ocean Pollution

- “Changes to the ocean chemistry, currents, and temperatures have profound effects on global weather patterns, and human industrial and consumption activity is adversely impacting the oceans and their complex ecosystems. The result is a number of species are being driven to extinction.” (Young)
- Everything that goes into our oceans will affect its acidification and the ocean life that exists there. It faces oil, plastic, carbon emissions, and all kinds of pollutions affect the ocean.
- Coca cola was found to be one of the top plastic polluters. They were found to have plastic pieces in the wildlife in over 42 countries.
- They produce 3 million tons of plastic a year.
