



As you develop a plan to meet all of your graduation requirements, it is important to know when courses are typically offered, (e.g. Fall only, Spring only, Fall and Spring, etc.) This information is available in the Course Catalog in MyCSULB.

- Log into MyCSULB and access the Student Center
 - Click on "Browse Course Catalog" located under the Search tab
 - You can search for courses by selecting the first letter of the subject from the alphabetical index
- To view course detail information, click on the **Course Nbr** or **Course Title** links.
